



Fashion Head Scarf

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These make GREAT accessories for gals of all ages, with sizes for child and adult! Each $\frac{3}{4}$ yd of fabric actually makes 2 scarves!

Materials:

Sewing machines in good working order with all accessories

$\frac{3}{4}$ yd of fun cotton fabric- non-directional fabric (fabric with an all-over print) works best

Mettler cotton 50 wt silk finish thread to coordinate with fabric

25 mm bias tape maker

$\frac{1}{4}$ " Stitch Witchery

Rotary cutting equipment including cutter, 24" ruler, 20 $\frac{1}{2}$ " and 16 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares if you have them

Construction:

Wash, dry and spray starch fabric if desired. Cut a 16 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares for a head scarf for a child or a 20 $\frac{1}{2}$ " square for a head scarf for an adult from the fabric and 2 - 1 $\frac{3}{4}$ " wide strips across the width of the fabric for ties (you will need 1 tie per scarf)

Cut each square in half once on the diagonal. Place the two resultant triangles right sides together, pin and sew along the two short edges with a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance. Trim and grade the corner. Turn right sides out and press. Edge stitch along the two short edges.

Pass one of the 1 $\frac{3}{4}$ " strips through the bias tape maker using the iron to press. Do not trim the beginning end of the fabric. After the strip is pressed, trim off any noticeable selvages.

Open out the pressed strip, center it along the cut edge of the scarf and sew the strip (single layer) to the scarf with about $\frac{1}{2}$ " seam allowance (sew a bit less than where the pressed crease line is on the tie). Turn the strip to the back, secure in place with Stitch Witchery, making sure that the folded edge is positioned just below the stitching line. Fuse the tie ends of the strip, also.

Edge stitch along the ties/trim of the scarf all the way down the strip, sewing with the open (non-stitched) side of the trim facing up!
